

purposes of the Church Building Acts 1818 to 1884 WHEREAS under or by virtue of an Indenture of Settlement (hereinafter called "the said Settlement ") bearing date the Twenty-Ninth day of March one thousand nine hundred and one and expressed to be made between The Most Honourable William Thomas Brownlow Fifth Marquess of Exeter (thereinafter and hereinafter called "the Marquess") of the one part and The Right Honourable George Fitzroy Henry Baron Raglan The Honourable John Pakenham Joicey-Cecil and George Brooke of the other part the piece of land hereinafter described and expressed to be hereby conveyed (together with other hereditaments of great value) now stands limited and settled to uses under which the Marquess is tenant for life in possession thereof free from incumbrances with power to grant for a nominal consideration or gratuitously any part or parts of the hereditaments included in the said Settlement (not exceeding one acre) in fee simple as (inter alia) a Burial Ground AND WHEREAS with a view to the said piece of land hereinafter described being conveyed as an Additional Burial Ground for the Parish of Great Casterton in the County of Rutland The Marquess has requested the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") to accept a conveyance of the same for the purpose aforesaid which they the Commissioners have agreed to do on the said piece of land being conveyed to them in the form and in manner hereinafter appearing NOW THESE PRESENTS WITNESS that in pursuance of the said agreement and in consideration of the premises the Marquess as such tenant for life as aforesaid and in pursuance of the power contained in the said Settlement DOTH HEREBY (as Settlor) freely and voluntarily and without any valuable consideration give grant and convey unto the Commissioners ALL THAT piece of land containing an area of one acre or thereabouts situate in the New Parish of All Saints' Stamford in the County of Lincoln and bounded on or towards the north-east by the Great North Road on or towards the south-east and south-west by other land vested in the Marquess and on or towards the north-west by the River Guash as the same piece of land hereinbefore described is more particularly delineated on the plan drawn on these presents

and is thereon coloured pink TO HOLD the same UNTO the Commissioners and their successors for the purposes of the said Church Buildings Acts and to be appropriated as and for an Additional Burial Ground for the Parish of Great Casterton aforesaid and to be devoted when consecrated to Ecclesiastical purposes for ever by virtue and according to the true intent and meaning of the said hereinbefore mentioned Church Building Acts AND the Commissioners in pursuance of the provisions in this behalf contained in the Fourteenth Section of the Church Building Act 1845 DO Television HEREBY DECLARE that the said piece of land hereinbefore expressed to be conveyed shall after the due consecration thereof be and be deemed to be part of the Parish of Great Casterton aforesaid PROVIDED ALWAYS AND IT IS HEREBY AGREED AND DECLARED between the parties hereto that so much of the said piece of land hereinbefore described and expressed to be hereby conveyed as is situate within fifty feet of the River Guash shall not be used for burials? AND the Marquess hereby acknowledges the right of the Commissioners to production of the said Settlement and to delivery of copies thereof IN WITNESS whereof the Marquess hath hereunto set his hand and seal and the Commissioners have caused their Common Seal to be hereunto affixed this day of thousand nine hundred and twenty-
